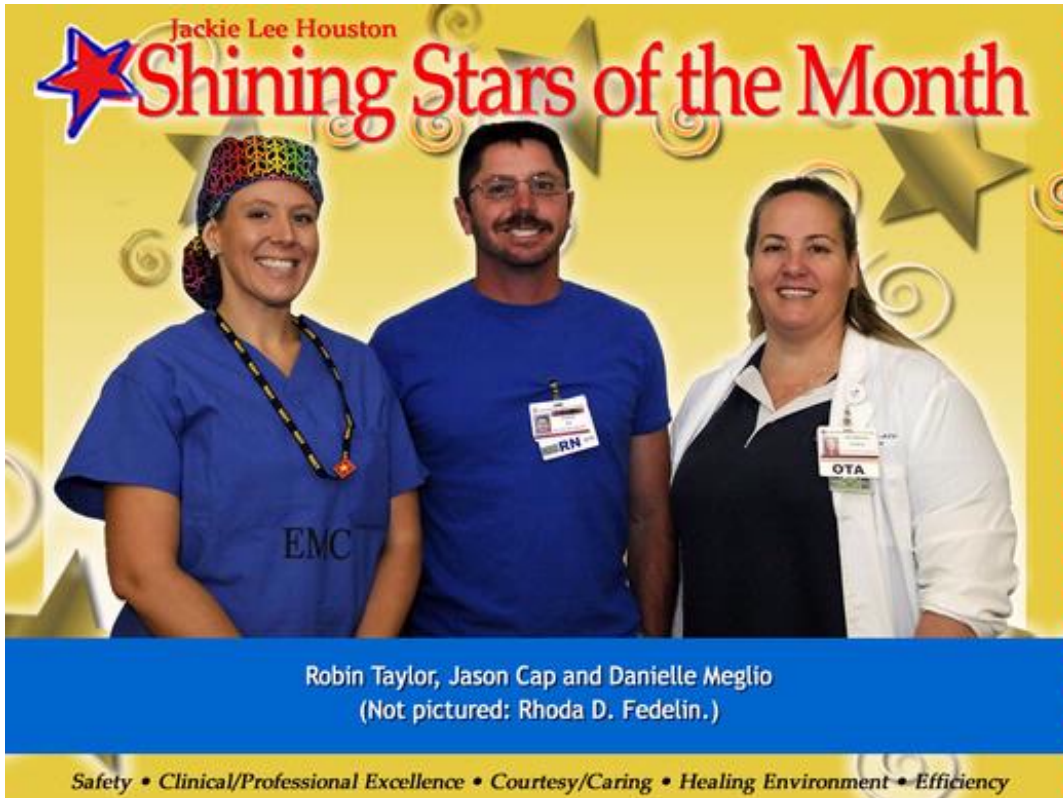


Jackie Lee Houston Shining Stars August 2013

SITUATION/TASK: On March 20, 2013, I was asked to provide a urologic consultation in the intensive care unit. This was in regards to the patient in urinary retention and could not be moved to the operating room for cystoscopy under anesthesia. There were some significant urologic equipment issues which precluded rapid and convenient resolution of this patient's urinary retention/stricture problem.

Due to the extreme extra efforts Robin Taylor, Jason Cap, RN and Michelle Domaracki we were able to obtain all of the appropriate equipment, additional equipment as required, flexible cystoscopy with light source and subsequently resolved this patient's urethral stricture disease, urinary retention, pain and allow adequate monitoring of the patient's urine output. This is all well documented in the consultation that I dictated on March 20, 2013.
